Information notes

Applying for Medals for deceased personnel

- If you are applying for a medal for a service person who is deceased the declaration form needs to be completed by the person who believes they have the best legal claim in accordance with the law; the order of entitlement generally being as shown below:
 - The beneficiary under the deceased's Will
 - The legally recognised partner, i.e. Wife, Husband, Widow, Widower, Civil Union or Partner
 - Son or Daughter
 - Grandson or Granddaughter
 - Father or Mother
 - Brother or Sister, including Half-Brother or Half-Sister
 - Grandparents
- Note 1: When none of the above persons are still living then NZDF is able to issue the unclaimed medal(s) to another person named as next-of-kin in official records, step-son or step-daughter, nephew or niece, great-nephew or great-niece.
- Note 2: Family members are required to agree amongst themselves as to who will apply for and receive any unclaimed medals. Only one of each medal will be issued.
- You will be required to provide a certified copy of the following documentation (please do not send us any original documents):
 - Proof of relationship (e.g. full Birth Certificate including parents' names to show the link, Marriage Certificate or Power of Attorney).
 - Notification of death (e.g. scanned copy of either Death Certificate, Death Notice, Photo of headstone or other documentary evidence that proves that the relative is deceased)*

**Note: this is not required if the person died while on military service, or if you have previously supplied this documentation to the NZDF Personnel Archives & Medals office.*
 - The written and signed permission of the legal beneficiary of the Will or person(s) with the best legal entitlement if that is not you.

- Please note that the NZDF only replaces medals during the lifetime of the former service person. NZDF cannot replace First World War medals and does not sell replica (copy) medals. Duplicate or replica medals including miniature medals can be purchased from various medal dealers in New Zealand, whose contact details can be found via an internet search for 'replica medals NZ' or searching the Yellow Pages under 'medals'.
